National Statistics Board

- Statutory body under Statistics Act 1993
- Department of Taoiseach
- Guide strategic direction of CSO by
 - Developing strategic priorities for compilation and development of official statistics and ensuring that the necessary resources and cooperation from other public authorities are available to the CSO

NSB STRATEGY 2009-2014 National Context

- Recession, banking and regulatory systems failures, pressure on public finances, disillusionment with measures of progress
 - greater demand for regular and timely statistics
 - emerging statistical needs
 - resource constraints and emphasis on VFM
 - Need to address data gaps and enhance existing data in key areas e.g. environment, measuring progress

NSB Strategic Priorities

- 1. Ensure coherence of Irish Statistical System (ISS)
- 2. Prioritise investment in statistics to underpin policy
- 3. Maximise value of data and minimise burden on providers
- 4. Ensure that official statistics are 'fit for purpose'
- 5. Prioritise links with users

Statistics and Policy

- Monitoring trends
- Informing decisions e.g. spending, services
- Policy effectiveness and VFM
- Assessment of progress, dynamics of change and international comparisons
- Better services to citizens

Administrative Data Crucial

Irish Statistical System (ISS)

- CSO + range of other data providers mainly Govmt Depts. and agencies
- ISS must be a coherent whole system that is policy oriented
- Networking between admin data providers and CSO crucial
- Need to maximise value of data collected and minimise burden on users

Whole System Approach in Practice

- Statistical Potential of Administrative Records (SPAR)
- Data strategies in Departments to prioritise needs and identify critical gaps
- Developing statistical frameworks and addressing data integration issues
- Suilding statistical competence

SPAR

- Three SPAR exercises detailed reports and recommendations
- Key issues were
 - data organisation and integration
 - classification and coding systems
 - development of core sets of indicators
 - ongoing identification of information needs

NSB has recommended review of progress and further steps needed

Data Strategies

- considerable engagement but much to be done
- o good progress in some Depts.
- identification and prioritisation of data gaps crucial

NSB has recommended CSO consult further, review progress and identify way forward

Key Infrastructural Issues

- Unique business identifier and Central Business Register
- Onique personal identifiers
- Spatial and geographic data capture

Linking Data, Linking People

- CSO engagement and work with Depts. should be priority for both
- Departments, agencies etc need to take ownership of the ISS and their role in it
- Data strategies should identify priorities and set out standards and protocols for data collection

NSB believes partnership between providers/users key to better use of administrative data
