## Almost 100,000 days lost in industrial disputes

During 2000, there were 97,046 days lost to industrial disputes. This is less than half the number of days lost in 1999, when 215,587 days were lost.

However, the number of industrial disputes in 2000 increased to 39. This is the highest annual number of industrial disputes since 1993 when there were 48 disputes. The 39 disputes which occurred in 2000 affected 28,192 workers and 41 firms.

The effect of the teachers' dispute can be seen in the results for the fourth quarter of 2000, where over two thirds (or 45,795) of the 63,705 days lost were in the Education sector. *See Table 1*.

Other features include:

- ♦ The 63,705 days lost in quarter four of 2000, compares to 178,532 days lost in the fourth quarter of 1999.
- ♦ The 12 industrial disputes in progress in the fourth quarter of 2000 involved 22,517 workers and 11 firms. *See Table 1*.

# **Background Notes**

The information on Industrial Disputes is based on details supplied by the Monitoring Unit of the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment and on information collected directly from other sources by the Central Statistics Office.

**Scope** Disputes are included in this release if they involve a stoppage of work lasting for at least one day and the total time lost is 10 or more person-days.

Days Lost In calculating days lost, it is assumed that work would have continued if no dispute had occurred. No allowance is made for loss of work from unemployment or other causes (such as bad weather) which might have happened even if there was no dispute. The number of days lost is calculated by multiplying the number of persons involved by the number of normal working days during which they were involved in the dispute. Persons working for approximately 40 hours per week are assumed to be working the equivalent of a 5 day week even if the work is spread over more than 5 days.

**Disputes in Progress** 

The tables show data on disputes which began and disputes which were in progress in each quarter. The quarterly figures for the number of disputes in progress and for the number of firms and workers involved will not always add to the annual total, since an industrial dispute can be in progress in more than one quarter.
